MAR 2 **1838** *The Clydesdale Bank*

On this day in 1838 the Clydesdale Bank was founded in Glasgow by a group of merchants - "liberal radicals" according to Checkland's *Scottish Banking History* (1967). The bank survived and expanded during various economic disturbances, and in 2018 it acquired Virgin Money and announced that the Clydesdale Bank and the Yorkshire Bank would change to reflect the Virgin Money brand.
