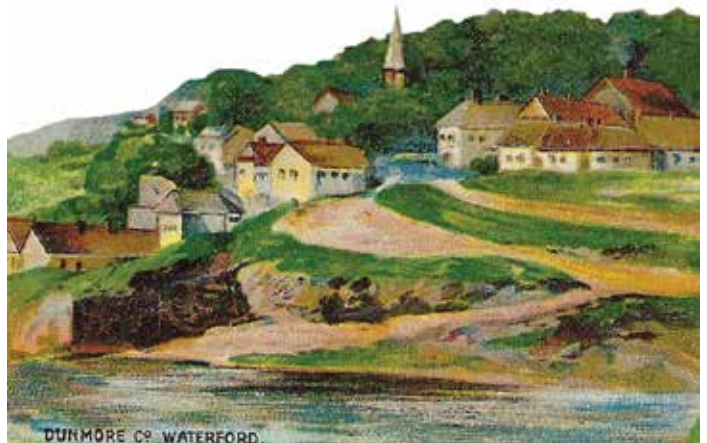

Dunmore Lasses (traditional)
