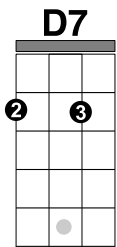
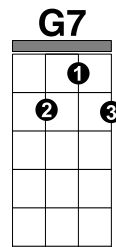
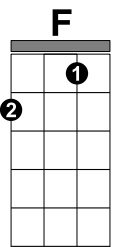
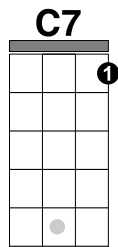
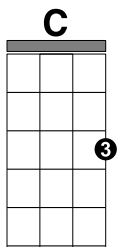
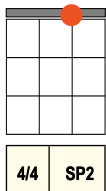
Stupid Cupid (Sedaka/Greenfield)
