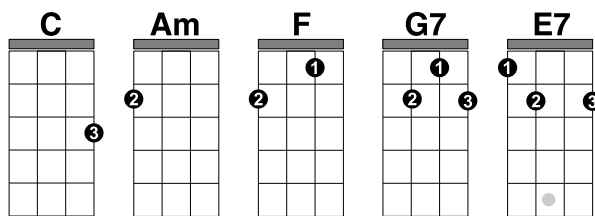
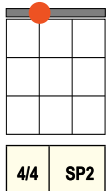
Ch C F C G7
