Oh, babe, I hate to go....

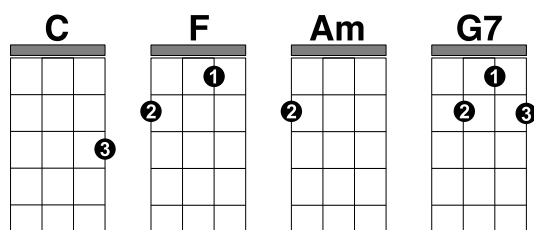
**2** C / F / C / F /

I tell you now, they don't mean a thing;

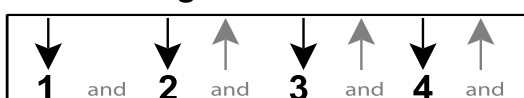
C / F / C / F /
