New World (Anton Dvorak)

Dvořák's Symphony No.9 in E minor - "From the New World" - was composed in 1893 and premiered in New York in December of that year. Dvořák was influenced by Native American music and African-American spirituals. Given above is from the second movement, the Largo, and is familiar to many as the theme to a Hovis bread television advertisement.
