December 1963 (Oh What a Night) (Gaudio/Parker)

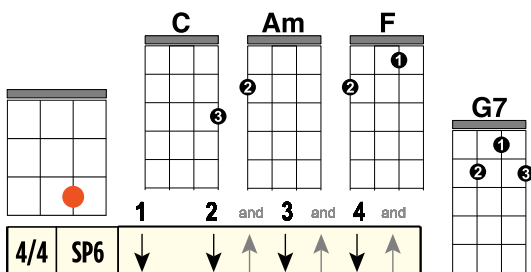
1 (Oh, what a) night, late December back in 'sixty-three.
