



Ode to Joy




The New World Symphony by Czech composer Antonin Dvorák ((1841-1904) was commissioned by the New York Philharmonic, and was first performed in 1893.




Prelude to Te Deum

Marc-Antoine Charpentier (1643-24 1704) was a French composer of the Baroque era. He actually wrote six **Te Deum**s, but this prelude is the best known. In 1954 is was chosen as the anthem for European Broadcasting Union.



Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart (1756-1791) composed his suite **Eine Kleine Nachtmusik** ("a little serenade") in 1787.




Toreador Song

This popular melody is to be found in the opera *Carmen* by Georges Bizet (1838-1875, which premiered in 1875. It was not well received at that time, but has since become one of the most performed operas of them all.

illiam Tell Overture



Gioachino Rossini (1792-1868) composed his final opera William Tell in 1829. This overture is well known because of its association with two television series of the 1950s.







Coates





