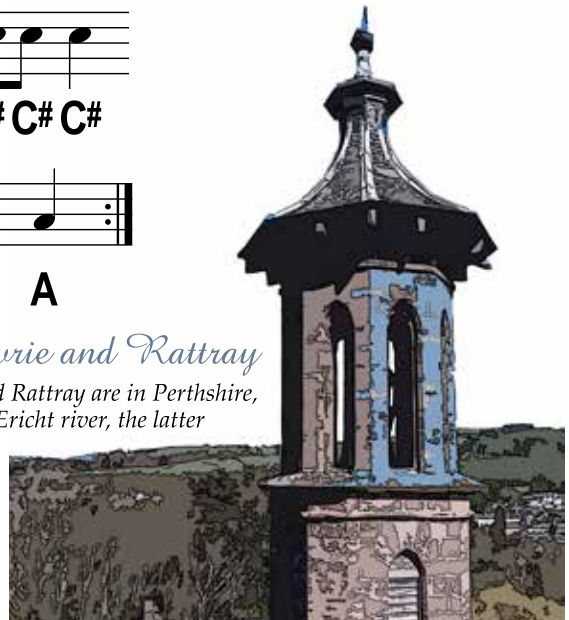

### Blairgowrie and Rattray

The twin burghs of Blairgowrie and Rattray are in Perthshire, the former southwest of the Ericht river, the latter northwest, joined by the Brig o' Blair. The town is at the centre of the Scottish soft fruit Milton of Rattray is a Neolithic cursus (a rectangular monumental structure resembling a ditch) lying 1km east of Blair.
