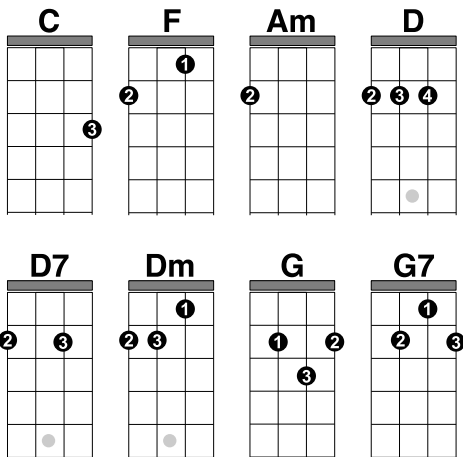
I Love a Lassie (Harry Lauder)
