

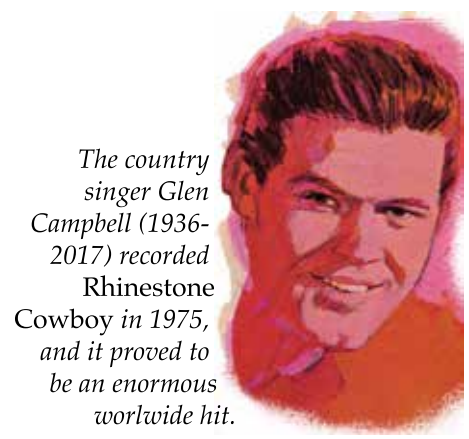
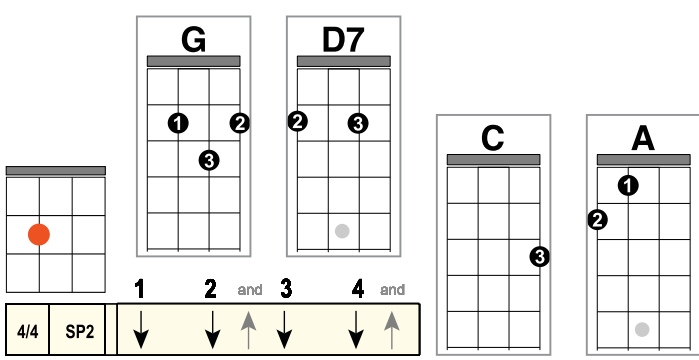
Rhinestone Cowboy (Larry Weiss)
